

Sevki ACUNER currently holds the position of EBRD Director for Ukraine (since 2013). Previously, he held the position of EBRD Deputy Country Director for Turkey. During his 21-year career at the EBRD, Mr. Acuner occupied senior manager positions in the Credit Risk and Agribusiness departments before being appointed to Turkey in 2009. Prior to joining the EBRD, Mr. Acuner worked at the Central Bank of Turkey, the Bank of Montreal and the Royal Bank of Canada in various North American and European countries. Mr. Acuner is a Turkish national and holds a BSc in Management from Bosphorus University, Istanbul, and an MBA from Concordia University, Montreal, Canada.

Alain AESCHLIMANN is Head of Delegation for Ukraine in the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) since 2015. Mr. Aeschlimann has been working in the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) since 1987. His field appointments included Deputy Head of Delegation in Angola and Peru; Head of Delegation in Iraq, Israel and the Autonomous and Occupied Palestinian Territories, and Ethiopia. Mr. Aeschlimann served as Former Coordinator for operational Legal Advisers, Deputy and then Head of Central Tracing Agency and Protection Division, and Head of Operations (Regional Director) for South-East Asia, East Asia and the Pacific at ICRC headquarters in Geneva. He is the author of several articles on humanitarian issues and action (“Protection of IDPs: an ICRC View”; “Protection of Detainees: ICRC Action Behind Bars”; “The development of protection in the field by the ICRC”; “Overview of protection issues in contexts of multinational peace operations” and others). Mr. Aeschlimann holds a Degree in Law from the University of Neuchâtel, Switzerland. He is a Lawyer registered at the Bar of Neuchâtel.

Olga AIVAZOVSKA heads the Board of the All-Ukrainian NGO “Civil Network OPORA”, and is an international expert in the realm of elections and legislature. Ms. Aivazovska served as a director of the national nonpartisan election observation missions in Ukraine with over 20,000 activists in 2010-2016, and participated in electoral observation in more than a dozen European countries. Ms. Aivazovska represents Ukraine in a political subgroup of the Trilateral Contact Group (Ukraine-Russia-OSCE) on conflict settlement in the Eastern Ukraine. She was included in top 100 most influential and most successful women of Ukraine in 2014, 2015 and 2016, according to such political media as Focus and the Novoie Vremia. Ms. Aivazovska is an alumna of the Draper Hills Summer Fellowship on Democracy and Development Program at Stanford University's Center on Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law, and of the Ukrainian School of Political Studies.

Liubov AKULENKO is an expert in supervision of information and advocacy campaigns that popularize the EU integration process and the main provisions of the Association Agreement. Currently he is a member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the Chairman of the Subcommittee on Inter-parliamentary Liaison Office, Bilateral and Multilateral Relations in the Parliament of Ukraine. Mr. Arieiev also chairs the Ukrainian Delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of Council of Europe (PACE) where he serves as the President of PACE Committee for Culture, Education, Science and Media, as well as PACE General Rapporteur on Media Freedom and Safety of Journalism. Ertuğrul APAKAN is the Chief Monitor of the OSCE Monitoring Mission to Ukraine as of April 14, 2014. In 2009-2012, Ambassador Apakan served as the Permanent Representative of Turkey to the United Nations. Previously, he held the positions of Undersecretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Turkey from 2006 to 2009 and Deputy Undersecretary for Bilateral Political Relations from 2004 to 2006. Throughout his diplomatic career in 1971-2012, Ambassador Apakan has served at various levels in Ankara and in number of diplomatic missions, including the Embassies in Vienna, Kuwait, and Nicosia, where he became Deputy Chief of Mission and later Ambassador. From August 2009 to the end of 2010, Ambassador Apakan represented Turkey at the UN Security Council (SC). He assumed the Presidency of the Council in September 2010. He also undertook the Chairmanship of three SC Committees – on counter-terrorism, sanctions on the Democratic People’s Republic of Korea (DPRK) and Democratic Republic of Congo. During his term, Turkey acted as a lead country on issues related to Afghanistan. He also co-chaired the Groups of Friends of the UN Alliance of Civilizations.

Anders Åslund is a Senior Fellow at the Atlantic Council and an Adjunct Professor at Georgetown University. He is a leading specialist on economic policy in Russia, Ukraine, and the Eastern Europe. He is Chairman of the Advisory Council of the Center for Social and Economic Research (CASE), Warsaw. Dr. Åslund has worked as an economic adviser to several governments, including the Russian and the Ukrainian governments. He is the author of 14 books and editor of 16 books. He was founding director of the Stockholm Institute of Transition Economics and professor at the Stockholm School of Economics. Dr. Åslund served as a Swedish diplomat in Moscow, Geneva, Poland, and Kuwait. He earned his PhD from the University of Oxford.

Petras AUŠTREVČIUS is a Member of the European Parliament and Vice-Chair of the Group of the Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe (ALDE). He works as a full member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs and Subcommittee on Human Rights, and as a substitute member of the Committee on Regional Development. Mr. Auštrevičius is a chair of an informal group “Friends of European Ukraine. ” Previously, he was a member of the Seimas of the Republic of Lithuania for 10 years. In 2001-2002, Mr. Auštrevičius was a Chief Negotiator for Lithuania’s membership in the European Union. In 1998-2004, he gained valuable work experience while holding high-ranking positions in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Office of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania. In 1994–1997, Mr. Auštrevičius was Lithuania’s Ambassador to Finland. Mr. Auštrevičius has a diploma in Economics from Vilnius State University. He completed doctoral studies at the Institute of Economics of the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences and graduated from the Diplomat Training Program by the Hoover Institution at Stanford University, USA. Mr. Auštrevičius is a co-founder and the first Chairman of the Liberals’ Movement of the Republic of Lithuania.

Arsen AVAKOV is the Minister of Internal Affairs of Ukraine since 27 February 2014. In his capacity, Mr. Avakov involved and appointed, for the first time in the history of Ukraine, civil society representatives, including members of the Self-Defense Maidan, as Ministry's senior officials. In March 2014 he initiated the establishment of the National Guard of Ukraine. On his initiative and under his direction there were formed the NGU first and second reserve volunteer battalions. Those units have been mostly composed of Self-Defense Maidan participants who went to the training camp directly from the Maidan. On 14 April 14 2016 Mr. Avakov was approved as the Minister of Internal Affairs of Ukraine in the Cabinet of Ministers, headed by Vladimir Groisman, for the third time by the Verkhovna Rada. He is the Honored Economist of Ukraine and has I rank of civil servant. Mr. Avakov is married and has a son.

Serhii BABAK is member of the National Agency of Higher Education Quality Assurance created to increase higher education quality, reform the accreditation system, assure academic integrity and ethics, fight against plagiarism in the academic and educational spheres, and reform the system of scientific degrees conferment. In addition to holding a PhD in Economics, he is a Doctor of Technical Sciences and author of more than 50 scientific and research papers including eight textbooks and monographs. Dr. Babak's previous experience includes working as Director of Scientific and Technical Center of Emerging Technologies at the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, Vice Rector at the University of Emerging Technologies, Deputy Secretary General at ICC Ukraine, Ukrainian League of Industrialists and Entrepreneurs. He is an expert in drone construction and production, computerized systems of remote control and diagnostics, management and commercialization of scientific developments as well as international economic relations, law and psychology. Dr. Babak is also a master of motorsport of Ukraine and Champion of Ukraine.

Yana BARINOVA is the Chief Operating Officer of the Babi Yar Holocaust Memorial Center (BYHMC). The BYHMC is a nonprofit educational institution that commemorates the Holocaust, in particular the Babi Yar mass shootings of September 1941. Having graduated with two Master degrees in both Philosophy and Economics, Ms. Barinova became involved in the social and cultural sector activities. She is a PhD, an MBA graduate, and a founder of the Vienna-based consulting company “CREAPOLIS”. Ms. Barinova authored more than 80 articles. She possesses the wealth of ten-year working experience holding various positions while living in different cities such as Brussels, Vienna, Moscow and Paris.

Marieluise BECK is a Member of the German Bundestag, where she is a spokesperson of the Green Parliamentary Group on the Committee on Foreign Affairs and a substitute member of the Committee on the EU Affairs. As the spokesperson on Eastern European affairs for the Green Parliamentary Group, Ms. Beck has focused on issues concerning the Russian Federation and the Eastern Partnership countries like Belarus and Ukraine, as well as the Western Balkans. She holds positions as the Chairperson of the German-Bosnian and Vice-Chair of the German-Ukrainian Parliamentary Friendship Groups in the German Bundestag. Ms. Beck is a Member of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe and the OSCE. Since the early 1990s, Ms. Beck has been actively concerned with human rights issues. She helped to launch the initiative 'Bridge of Hope', an aid agency for Bosnia and Herzegovina, which was arranged for innumerable consignments of aid to be taken to war-torn areas. For this work, Ms. Beck was awarded the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany and made an honorary citizen of the Bosnian municipality of Lukavac. She studied German, history and sociology. In 1983, Ms. Beck was elected to the German Bundestag for the first time.

Iryna BEKESHKINA is a Senior Research Fellow at the Institute of Sociology of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, and the Director of Ilko Kucheriv Democratic Initiatives Foundation (DIF). DIF is one of the oldest and most authoritative think tanks in Ukraine (founded in 1992). The DIF mission is to support Ukraine's transition toward a fully functioning democracy, which should include better operation of governance and market economy, and the development of civil society in Ukraine. In early 2016, the DIF became one of the 50 leading think tanks in Central and Eastern Europe. Ms. Bekeshkina is a well-known sociologist who has authored more than hundred research papers, as well as many publications in media, especially on the issues of political transformations and elections in Ukraine. In 2006-2016, she was ranked among top 100 most influential women in Ukraine. She is a member of the Council of National Unity under the President of Ukraine, the Collegium under the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine, and a number of other public structures. Ms. Bekeshkina works intensively with media and often participates in popular TV shows.

Eliav BELOTSERCOBSKY is Ambassador of the State of Israel to Ukraine. Ambassador Belotsercovsky was born in 1963 and repatriated to Israel in 1973. Following army service he began his studies at Hebrew University of Jerusalem from which he obtained a BA in International Relations and Chinese Studies and MSc in International Management. In 1995 Ambassador Belotsercovsky joined the Foreign Ministry. He served in such countries as Singapore, Cyprus, and India.

Sergii BEREZENKO is Member of the Ukrainian Parliament. He was born on the 11th of April, 1984 in a family of doctors. In 2001, after graduating from a school with a gold medal, he entered to the National University of "Kyiv-Mohyla Academy", where he studied at the Faculty of Economics. In 2005, he obtained a Bachelor's degree in Economic Theory and continued his studies in the program of a specialist in Economic Theory. From 2006 to 2014 he was a deputy of the Kyiv City Council. Before his duty in the Parliament, he took the position of the Head of the State Department of Affairs in 2014-2015. Mr. Berezenko was elected to the Parliament in 2015, where he is an active member of the Verkhovna Rada Committee on Health Care. From September 2016 Mr. Berezenko is the Deputy Chair of the parliamentary faction of "Petro Poroshenko Bloc". Mr. Berezenko acted as the initiator and co-author of important laws on the reform of health care in Ukraine. Mr. Berezovets also serves as the external advisor to the Secretary of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine (2016-present). He was born in Kerch, Crimea, Ukraine. Mr. Berezovets graduated from Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, Institute of Journalism, in 1997. In 2003 he completed his studies at the Royal College of Defense Studies (London, UK) becoming the youngest member in RCDS's history. In 2004 Mr. Berezovets received an MA in International Studies from King's College London. In 2011 he was selected to represent Ukraine among young leaders from Central and Eastern Europe in the prestigious John Smith Memorial Trust Programme (UK). In 2015 Mr. Berezovets wrote a book titled "Annexation: Island of Crimea. Chronicles of the hybrid warfare". In November 2016, he has the honor to speak at a congressional hearing in Washington on the situation in Crimea. Mr. Berezovets is a permanent commentator on Ukraine in the international media; his comments have appeared in The New York Times, The Economist, The Financial Times, The Times.

David BEZHUASHVILI is a philanthropist and the founder of a non-profit organization "Education Foundation" that supports educational programs in Georgia and invests in the protection of national cultural heritage. Dr. Bezhuashvili served as a Member of the Parliament of Georgia from the single- mandate constituency of Tetrtskaro Region from 1999 to 2016 (5th to 8th convocations). In 1999-2013, he worked in various subdivisions and committees of the Parliament of Georgia contributing to political and legislative advancement of Georgia. From 2013 to 2016, he sat on the Committee for European Integration of the Parliament of Georgia. Prior to his parliamentary career, Dr. Bezhuashvili was a successful entrepreneur holding the posts of Chairman of the Supervisory Board in JSC "Saltransgazmretsvi", as well as of Chairman of the Board of Directors and General Director of JSC "Sakgazi". In addition, in 1994, he founded the company "Chemexim International Ltd" that included the Georgian Industrial Group (GIG). Having such profound expertise, Dr. Bezhuashvili shared his knowledge and experience in the book titled "National Bank's Monetary Credit Policy and the Prospects for the Development of the Banking System" in 1999. Dr. Bezhuashvili graduated from Tbilisi State University's Department of Economics, majoring in Macroeconomics. He later obtained a PhD in Economics in 1999. In 2013, Dr. Bezhuashvili was decorated with the Victory Order of St. George for exceptional contribution to Georgia's development and progress. In 2002-2014, he served as the President of Weightlifting Federation of Georgia. Dr. Bezhuashvili is married and has two sons. He fluently speaks Georgian and Russian.

Gela BEZHUASHVILI is Chairman and CEO at David Bezhuashvili's NGO "Education Foundation". He started his public sector career at the Department of International Law of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia in 1991. He also served as Deputy Chief of Mission at the Embassy of Georgia in Astana. Amb. Bezhuashvili continued his public service as a Deputy Minister of Defense and later, as the first civilian Minister of Defense and Secretary of the National Security Council of Georgia (NSC). In 2005, he was appointed Minister of Foreign Affairs of Georgia. Amb. Bezhuashvili was actively involved in reforming the security sector at the NSC and later served as Director of the National Intelligence Service. In 1998-2000, Amb. Bezhuashvili worked with the EU official structures as a national expert in international law, anti-corruption and protection of national minorities. He contributed, in the capacity of a national expert on constitutional issues, to the Venice Commission. Amb. Bezhuashvili graduated from the Department of International Relations and International Law at Taras Shevchenko State University of Kyiv, with B.A. and LL.M degrees. He also holds an LL.M in International and Comparative Law from the Southern Methodist University (SMU) School of Law. Ambassador Bezhuashvili is an Edmund Muskie (1997) and Edward S. Mason Fellow (2004). He completed his studies at Harvard University, JFK School of Government, in 2011, and holds a Master's degree in Public Administration. Amb. Bezhuashvili was decorated with several Georgian and Ukrainian orders of merit, and has been recognized by distinguished public institutions for his contributions to public policy and leadership. Amb. Bezhuashvili is married, has two sons and a daughter. He fluently speaks English, Russian and Spanish languages.

Olga BIELKOVA is a Member of the Ukrainian Parliament and stands as Deputy Head of the Verkhovna Rada's Committee on Fuel and Energy Complex, Nuclear Policy and Nuclear Safety. She is also a member of the Petro Poroshenko Bloc faction and a permanent member of the Ukrainian Delegation to the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly. Ms. Bielkova additionally serves as a Member of the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative's (EITI) International Board, as well as Co-Chair of the Parliamentary Non-Partisan Caucus "For Energy Independence of Ukraine", "Green Energy of Changes" and "For Digital Future of Ukraine". Ms. Bielkova was elected as a Member of Parliament with Vitalii Klitschko's UDAR Party. Earlier, Ms. Bielkova was also part of the Executive Management Team at the Victor Pinchuk Foundation.

Bil IRENEUSZ is the Director of the Aleksander Kwaśniewski Foundation Amicus Europae. The Foundation is active in the area of foreign policy and security, focusing on the Eastern Neighborhood of the European Union. Previously, he worked as the Director of the Office of International Affairs of the Presidential Chancellery from 2004-2006 and as an expert on the National Security Bureau from 1997 to 2004. Mr. Ireneusz graduated from the Warsaw School of Economics (WSE) and the National Security Studies Program at the Warsaw University. He received his doctoral degree researching energy supply security at the WSE.

Daniel BILAK is Director of the Investment Promotion Office UkraineInvest and Chief Investment Adviser to the Prime Minister of Ukraine. Mr. Bilak was appointed as the Director of UkraineInvest and the Chief Investment Adviser to the Prime Minister of Ukraine by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine as of November 1, 2016. Together with the Government Commissioner for Investments, he guides investors and advises the Prime Minister on improvements to the investment and business environment in Ukraine. Canadian-qualified lawyer with over 25 years of professional experience in Ukraine and the region, he advised major international and Ukrainian businesses in the energy, agribusiness, infrastructure and technology sectors. Dmytro BILOTSERKOVETS is Member of Parliament of Ukraine. He was born in February 21, 1986 in Sevastopol, Crimea. From 2002 to 2007, he had been studying in the "European University" of Sevastopol, Master of Management. From 2006 to 2012, Mr. Bilotserkovets headed the executive committee of the NGO "Sevastopol without corruption". From 2007, he was the leader of Sevastopol pro-Ukrainian political moves, and from 2012 to 2015 headed the youth wing of the PP "UDAR" (Ukrainian Democratic Alliance for Reform) of Vitaliy Klitschko. In 2013, Mr. Bilotserkovets initiated the public movement "For Fair Sevastopol", however in March 2014 due to the annexation of the Crimea and pro-Ukrainian position had to move from Sevastopol to Kyiv. Since August 2014 and for now he is an adviser to the Mayor of Kyiv Vitaliy Klitschko. On top of that, from 2014 to 2016, he was also Director of the Department of infrastructure and ecology of the Kyiv City State Administration.

Nadiya BILOUS is Director of Corporate and Legal Affairs at the British American Tobacco Ukraine. She is responsible for the overall legal support within BAT Ukraine working in the fields of anti-competition law, management of AIT matters, corporate and marketing, among others. In 2017 Mr. Filipov received an award for the Ukrainian IT industry development. Earlier, in 2014, he received a Master's degree in Applied Physics from Department of Radiophysics, Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv. During his study in the university Mr. Filipov has been working as researcher and engineer at the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv and scientific company Elvatech Ltd.

Galina FOMENCHENKO is a Senior Political Adviser of the European People's Party based in Brussels. Stephane FOUKS is the Vice-President of Havas and Chairman of Havas Worldwide. In 1988, Stephane joined RSCG and co-founded “RSCG Public”, a Corporate Communication agency. He has developed this agency that has since then become Euro RSCG C&O, and conquered the place of the leading Corporate & Financial Communication agency in France. In 2003 he took the position of CEO in Euro RSCG Worldwide France and became Executive Co-Chairman in 2005. Since 2009, he has been Administrator for IMAGINE Foundation and for IRIS. Stephane Fouks has also joined the Board of Directors of ‘Medecins Sans Frontière’ (Doctors without Borders) in 2009. In 2011, he became Vice-President of Havas Group. Stephane is an experienced international political advisor. He has been an advisor to the Polish President Aleksander Kwaśniewski (1995 - 2005) and the former Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak. He also used to work for the French Socialist Party. Mr. Fouks has been a Member of the YES Board and is now a member of the Circle of Friends of YES.

Štefan FÜLE is Czech diplomat and politician who currently is the MFA Special Envoy for the OSCE. He served as European Commissioner for Enlargement and Neighborhood Policy in 2010-2014. His political and professional career includes: European Affairs Minister (May 2009-November 2009); First Deputy Defense Minister (2001-2002); Permanent Representative to NATO (2005-2009); Ambassador to the UK (2003-2005) and Ambassador to Lithuania (1998-2001). He had served as Director of the MFA Departments dealing with multilateral diplomacy and security policy. He steered the process of the Czech Republic becoming a NATO Member State (1996-1998). Michael GAHLER has been a Member of the European Parliament since 1999 and is currently serving on the Committee on Foreign Affairs, where he is the Standing Rapporteur on Ukraine, and the Subcommittee on Security and Defense, where he is a spokesperson of the EPP Group. He chairs the Delegation for the Relations with the Pan-African Parliament, and holds membership in the South Africa Delegation, and Joint Parliamentary Assembly Africa Caribbean Pacific (ACP)-EU. Mr. Gahler studied law in Germany, with further studies in France, and later joined the Diplomatic School of the Foreign Office (1990-1991), after which he spent two years as a Desk Officer in the Department of International Environmental Politics. In 1993-1995, he served as the assistant in the International Office of the Christian Democratic Union (CDU). Iryna GERASHCHENKO is a Member of the Parliament of Ukraine and the First Deputy Chairperson of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine. Ms. Gerashchenko was first elected as a Member of Parliament in 2007 and subsequently re-elected in 2012 and 2014. In 2014-2016, she served as Chairperson of the Committee on European Integration of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine working on the issue of harmonizing Ukrainian legislation with the European norms and standards. Designated as the President's Commissioner in June 2014, Ms. Gerashchenko has been working to promote peaceful settlement of the conflict in the East of Ukraine and to create conditions for implementation of the plan of the Ukrainian President to peacefully settle the conflict. Larysa GOLNYK is a judge at the Oktiabrskiy District Court of Poltava, Ukraine. She has degrees in History and Law. Ms. Golnyk was appointed as a judge in 2010. Currently, her term of office has expired and she has no mandate to execute legal proceedings. In the course of discharging her functions, Ms. Golnyk considered the case of a corruption offense committed by the Mayor of Poltava in 2014. She reported to the law enforcement agencies on an attempt to bribe her via an intermediary, and, with their help, documented the illegal actions of the aforementioned individuals. As a result, the uncompromising judge faced persecution on the part of the city Mayor and of the Chairman of Court, where she worked. Abuses at the leadership level of the Poltava Prosecutor's Office resulted in termination of the Mayor's case, and only the intermediary has been brought before the court. Ms. Golnyk successfully insisted and brought the aforementioned case before the Committee on Corruption Prevention and Counteraction of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine, with the investigation of the Mayor's crime having been renewed by the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine.

Vladyslav GOLUB is an independent Member of the Parliament of Ukraine since November 2014. He sits on the Committee of Legal Affairs and Justice and holds membership in the Parliamentary Delegation to PACE. Previously, from March 2014 to July 2014, he served as Deputy Head of Kyiv City State Administration. In his career, Mr. Golub also practiced Banking and Finance Law in such leading law firms as Baker & McKenzie and Avellum Partners.

Andrey GOROKHOV is Chief Executive Officer of UMG. Mr. Gorokhov has been managing UMG since 2009. He has more than fifteen years of experience in M&A, investment management, corporate governance and finance. Before joining UMG, Mr. Gorokhov worked at United Capital (asset management), SCM (asset management), PwC (finance consulting and auditing) and the ARBED Group (metal industry). During his career, Mr. Gorokhov has gained significant practical experience in investment, mining, machinery, transport, energy, metal and other industries. Under Mr. Gorokhov's management, UMG has seen a seven-fold increase in the capitalization of its investment portfolio, growing to USD 400 million. Judith GOUGH is Her Majesty's Ambassador to Ukraine since September 2015. Ms. Gough joined the Foreign and Commonwealth Office in 2001 and prior to her appointment to Ukraine was the FCO Director for Eastern Europe and Central Asia. She has been engaged with this region for over twenty years and previously served as Her Majesty's Ambassador in Tbilisi. Ms. Gough has also served in the British Embassy in Seoul and, prior to joining the FCO, gained valuable business experience working as a Consultant at Ernst and Young, in Emerging Markets and Financial Services.

Iaroslav GREGIRCHAK is a seasoned lawyer with more than 15 years of practical experience in cross-border corporate finance, secured transactions as well as in international arbitration and administrative law. At the Business Ombudsman Council Mr. Gregirchak leads the team of six investigators. He authored BOC's systemic reports on 5 topics devoted to the following challenges with the quality of business environment in Ukraine: administering taxes, abuse of powers by law enforcement authorities, competition law and policy, getting access to electricity and fighting raiding. In 2004-2010 he occupied leading positions with international law firms Chadbourne & Parke and Gide Loyrette Nouel. Besides, he possesses significant commercial law reform experience gained with the World Bank and USAID as the expert in such fields as secured transactions (in Ukraine and in Azerbaijan) as well as public finance with emphasis on sub-national borrowings and debt. Mr. Gryniv has started his political activity in 1987. In 1988-1989, he headed the NGO “Tovarystvo Leva” and later became one of the founders of the Narodnyi Rukh (People’s Movement) Party. During the presidential election campaign in 2004, Mr. Gryniv held the position of Deputy Chief of Staff and worked on Viktor Yushchenko’s campaign strategy. He became Director of the National Institute for Strategic Studies in 2005. Mr. Gryniv led Vitali Klitschko’s campaign during the Kyiv mayoral elections in 2006, and Petro Poroshenko’s campaign during the presidential elections in 2014. In July 2014, he was appointed Deputy Head of Presidential Administration of Ukraine. In the Parliament, Mr. Gryniv is Deputy Chairman of the Committee on Information and Communication. He graduated from the Faculty of Chemistry of the Ivan Franko National University of Lviv in 1983. In 1996, he received a second degree from the Law Faculty of Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv. In 1992, Mr. Gryniv completed the training courses for diplomatic personnel at the Institute of International Relations of Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv.

Kostyantyn GRYSHCENKO is a Ukrainian diplomat and politician. Since the time Ukraine gained independence, Mr. Gryshchenko has served in senior positions entailing responsibilities in various domains ranging from arms control and regional security to education and public health. He served as Vice Prime Minister of Ukraine (2012-2014), Minister of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine (2003-2005 and 2010-2012) and First Deputy Secretary of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine (2008-2010). His ambassadorial appointments include the posts of Head of Mission of Ukraine to NATO and Ambassador of Ukraine to Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg (1998-2000), Ambassador to the United States (2000-2003) and Ambassador to the Russian Federation (2008-2010). Anatoliy GRYTSENKO is the Leader of a political party “Civic Position” (“Hromadyanska Pozytsiya”). He is also an Associate Professor at the National University of “Kyiv-Mohyla Academy”. As a Minister of Defense of Ukraine, Dr. Grytsenko has accomplished a number of recognized reforms aimed at building strong and professional Ukrainian military forces. In 2002, Dr. Gudziak became Rector of the Ukrainian Catholic University taking up the position of its President in 2013. In 2012 he was appointed as the Bishop for Ukrainian Catholics in France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxemburg and Switzerland and presently is based in Paris. In 2015 Bishop Borys Gudziak became a Cavalier of the Order of Legion of Honor – the highest decoration in France.

Stefan GULLGREN is a career diplomat in the Swedish Foreign Service. He was Deputy Director-General and Head of the Department for Eastern Europe and Central Asia, Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Sweden in 2013-2017. In 2009-2013, he served as Ambassador of Sweden to Ukraine. From 2002 to 2009 Ambassador Gullgren worked at the Embassy of Sweden in Moscow, first as Counsellor for Political Affairs, then as Minister Plenipotentiary and Head of Section for Economic Affairs and Trade, and finally as Deputy Head of Mission. He was Desk Officer for Russia at the MFA in Stockholm (1998-2002), having previously served at the Embassy of Sweden in Moscow (1994-1998) as a Second Secretary (Political Affairs). Denis GURSKY is founder of the SocialBoost NGO and co-founder of 1991 Open Data Incubator. Mr. Gursky has initiated and has been actively engaged in the Open Data Reform in Ukraine as a public figure since 2013 and also through the development of the National Open Data Portal. Subsequently, he served as Open Data Advisor to the Prime Minister of Ukraine and fostered Ukraine's participation in the Global Open Data Index. Currently he is working on open data startups in the fields of agriculture, energy and infrastructure within the frameworks of 1991 Open Data Incubator. Mr. Gursky also helps to develop a startup ecosystem in Ukraine through hackathon series held at SocialBoost and 1991 Open Data Incubator and by promoting initiatives among the Parliament's lobby.

Sergiy GUSOVSKY is a board member of the East Europe Foundation. Mr. Gusovsky graduated with distinction from Kyiv Military Aviation Engineering Academy in 1988 where he earned a degree in Electrical Engineering. From 1988 through 1992, he served in the army in a position of science specialist at the Gagarin Cosmonauts Training Center (Moscow Oblast, Russia). Upon quitting the service in the army in 1992, Mr. Gusovsky returned to Kyiv and established a company that was distributing satellite communication systems of the Inmarsat consortium. During 1995-2001 he was involved in investment and real estate development business in Kyiv. In 1995 he became a co-founder of the osteria “Pantagrue”. Since 2011 he has been Managing Partner of Gusovsky's Restaurants (osteria “Pantagrue”, pizzeria “Napule”, cafe “O'café”, boutiquebar “Biancoro”, and restaurant “Shoti”). Mr. Gusovsky was elected as a Kyiv City Council Member with the “Samopomich” party in 2014 and has become the head of its faction. He ran for Kyiv mayor during 2015 local elections. Since 2015 Gusovsky has been a member of the Standing Committee of Kyiv City Council on local government, regional and international relations.

Andriy GUTA is a successful entrepreneur involved in creation of business value in the IT, food and property development. Mr. Guta is one of the founding shareholders in Mriya Agro Holding, where he has held a number of positions. From 2005-2011 Mr. Guta occupied a position of Co-Founder and Vice-President in Mriya AgroHolding. After leaving Mriya in 2011, he focused on building some of the most innovative businesses in IT, infrastructure and property development. From 2012, Mr. Guta has been the owner of the AIO Ventures Company which invests in and provides IT and consulting services to companies with wide range of business directions. Since then, Mr. Guta has been responsible for planning, strategy and development in his IT business. Mr. Guta was born in 1978 in Ternopil Oblast. Being a person ready to walk extra mile to achieve best possible result, in 1997 he entered Hogeschool Utrecht University of Applied Sciences, International Economy, in Netherlands, where he graduated as the Master of International Economy in 2005. Mr. Guta has a spouse, two daughters and two sons. In addition to Ukrainian, his native language, he also speaks English and German. Iryna GUTSAL is Director of the International Charity Fund «Ukrainian Philanthropic Marketplace» ubb.org.ua, the largest Ukrainian platform for online giving, which links social and charity projects with donors and businesses. Also, the platform provides a unique service to businesses helping to implement charity projects into CSR strategies. Ms. Gutsal is responsible for strategy development, fund project management, development and implementation of new projects and areas of activity of the fund, fundraising, and communication with partners. The main goals for her as the Director of “Ukrainian Philanthropic Marketplace” are increasing the credibility of the charitable organizations, learning of the transparency and accountability and changing the attitude to the Philanthropy at the national level. Before leading ubb.org.ua, she was a part of the team of Victor Pinchuk’s Foundation. She directly oversaw the largest privately funded Ukrainian scholarship initiative Zavtra UA. From 2011 to 2015 he was a member of the management board of one of the largest alcohol producers in Russia/CIS. Mr. Hart is a board member of a number of European companies and a member of the Supervisory Committee of the Alliance for Public Health in Ukraine, one of the country's largest charities. He was educated at Eton College and then Durham University where he graduated with First Class Honours in Russian and French. He holds an Executive MBA from London Business School.

Victor HARTWALL is Chairman of the Board of K.Hartwall Invest. The company's family office was founded in 2000, and Mr. Hartwall became its Managing Director. He currently holds board positions in several of the family's companies, for example, K.Hartwall Oy Ab, Diamond Beverages Oy Ab and Inkerman. Mr. Hartwall faced new challenges and tasks when, over ten years ago, the family founded a Ukraine-based real estate company, HT Property Development, with Leopolis Hotel being one of the family's investments. Mr. Hartwall was born in 1966 and has worked in several of the family's companies after graduating with a Master's degree in Economics from the Hanken School of Economics in 1992.

Charles HENDRY MP (Prof.) is a Consultant at Vitol. Mr. Hendry was Conservative Member of Parliament for Wealden from 2001-2015 and Minister of State for Energy from May 2010 until September 2012. He previously served as the Conservative Party's spokesman on energy issues in 2005-2010. On leaving Ministerial office, the Prime Minister appointed him as his Trade Envoy to Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan and Turkmenistan, a role he continued until leaving the Parliament in 2015. He is a Commissioner of the UK Pavilion at Expo 2017 in Kazakhstan on the theme of Future Energy. Since leaving Ministerial office, he has been appointed as Visiting Professor at the University of Edinburgh Business School, President of the British Institute of Energy Economics, and Patron of the Nuclear Institute. He works extensively in the energy sector, having been Chairman of the Forewind Consortium (Statoil, Statkraft, SSE and RWE) in 2013-2015, securing consent to build the world's largest offshore wind farm in the North Sea and an adviser on a possible electricity interconnector between Iceland and the United Kingdom. He is an adviser to Vitol, AECOM and London Oil & Gas. Mr. Hendry was educated at the University of Edinburgh, where he received an Honours Degree in Business Studies (B. Comm). He is a University Regent and also an Honorary Fellow of the Energy Institute.

John HERBST is Director of the Dinu Patriciu Eurasia Center at the Atlantic Council. Prior to that, he worked as Director of the Center for Complex Operations at National Defense University. Ambassador Herbst retired from the Foreign Service at the Department of State in 2010 with the rank of Career Minister following a thirty-one-year career. Most of his career was devoted to work on Eurasia and the Middle East. In his last four years at State, Ambassador Herbst served as Coordinator for Reconstruction and Stabilization (S/CRS). He oversaw the creation of the Civilian Response Corps, an interagency group of over 1000 civil servants trained and ready to deploy quickly to crises abroad. Under his management, S/CRS's initially provisional position in the Department was made permanent by inclusion in the State Department budget and the S/CRS budget grew from approximately \$6 million to over \$150 million. He served as the U.S. Ambassador to Ukraine in 2003-2006. In that capacity, Ambassador Herbst worked to enhance U.S-Ukrainian relations and ensure the conduct of a fair Ukrainian presidential election. He also worked to prevent a violent crackdown on the Orange Revolution. Earlier, he was the U.S. Ambassador to Uzbekistan, where he played a critical role in the establishment of an American base to facilitate the conduct of the Operation "Enduring Freedom" in Afghanistan. Ambassador Herbst also promoted U.S.-Uzbek relations, in part by encouraging the government in Tashkent to improve its human rights record. He also served as the U.S. Consul General in Jerusalem, the U.S. envoy to Yasir Arafat and the Palestinian Authority. Ambassador Herbst has written widely on Ukraine, Russia and Central Asia, and on stability operations, the Arab Spring and social media, and Eurasian security. His op-eds and articles have appeared in The New York Times, The Washington Post, The International Herald Tribune, The Atlantic, Foreign Policy, The Wall Street Journal, The American Interest, The National Interest and Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty. He has also appeared frequently on NBC, FOX, BBC, C-SPAN, CNN Bloomberg TV, Canadian TV and Al Jazeera. Ambassador Herbst has received two Presidential Distinguished Service Awards, the Secretary of State's Career Achievement Award, the State Department's Distinguished Honor Award, and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Distinguished Civilian Service Award. A widower, Ambassador Herbst has five children and six grandchildren.

Yevhen HLIBOVYTSKY is Strategic Advisor and Nestor Group member. He researches social values and how they affect institutional development in Ukraine and other countries of the former Soviet region. Mr. Hlibovytsky is a founder of pro.mova, a think-tank and a consulting company. Previously, he served as a member of Univska Group, which developed a strategic vision for Lviv (2007-2011) and as OSCE expert in countries of Central Asia and the Caucasus (2006-2013). He is a member of the supervisory boards of the Ukrainian Public Service Broadcast and hromadske.ua. Mr. Hlibovytsky co-authored the concepts for hromadske.tv (2013), and 5 kanal (2002). Mr. Hlibovytsky also teaches strategy as guest lecturer of various managerial programs at the Ukrainian Catholic University.

Jonathan HOLSLAG is a Professor of International Politics, Special Advisor to the First Vice-President of the European Commission, Postdoctoral Fellow of the Research Foundation Flanders, and lecturer at various defense colleges. He has a column in newspapers and magazines, such as Knack and de Volkskrant, and has published widely on geopolitics.

Serhii HORBATIUK is Head of the Directorate (initially Department) of Special Investigations at the Prosecutor General's Office of Ukraine since December 2014. He is responsible for investigation of crimes committed during the events of the Revolution of Dignity (November 2013-February 2014) as well as for the investigation of corruption crimes, including those involving misappropriation of state property and bribery committed by senior public officials in the period of 2010-2014. In addition to the investigative activities, together with the Directorate's staff Mr. Horbatiuk has been involved in the work on reforming the public prosecutor's agencies and improving current legislation in the sphere of criminal law and procedure. Until spring 2014 Mr. Horbatiuk worked as an investigator who climbed the career ladder and became a senior investigator in particularly important cases of the Prosecutor General's Office of Ukraine, where he has been working for more than ten years. Volodymyr HORBULIN is a celebrated Ukrainian statesman, politician and scientist, Dr. Eng., professor and academician. Dr. Horbulin is Director of the National Institute for Strategic Studies under the President of Ukraine (since 2014) and First Vice-President of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine (since 2015). Previously he served as Secretary of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine (1994-1999, 2006), Director of the Institute of National Security Problems of Ukraine (2003-2010), and Adviser to several Presidents of Ukraine. Dr. Horbulin was one of the authors of the National Security and Defense Concept of Ukraine, Strategy of National Security of Ukraine, Law “On Fundamentals of National Security of Ukraine”, State Program of Building and Development of Armed Forces of Ukraine, Concept of Structural Reorganization of Military-Industrial Complex of Ukraine and many others documents. As Director General of the National Space Agency of Ukraine (1992-1994), he managed the development and implementation of the first National Space Program of Ukraine. Dr. Horbulin founded the National Centre of Euro-Atlantic Integration of Ukraine (2003). In the 1960-80s he worked at the Yuzhnoye Design Bureau (Dnipro) where he was involved in the development of strategic rocket systems and spacecraft, and later coordinated rocket-and-space and aircraft equipment development programs at the republican level.

Vazil HUDÁK joined the European Investment Bank as Vice-President at the beginning of October, 2016. Prior to this office, he was appointed as the Chief Negotiator of the EU Budget during the Slovak Presidency of the Council of the European Union. He has served as Minister of Economy of the Slovak Republic from 2015 until 2016. Before this, he was State Secretary of the Ministry of Finance and Representative of the Slovak Republic on the Board of Governors in the European Stability Mechanism. He was also Industry Head for Public Sector of Eastern Europe in J.P. Morgan Chase and has worked for the Citi Group and EastWest Institute in U.S and Europe. Mr. Hudák started his career at the Federal Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Czechoslovakia. He studied at the Moscow State Institute of International Relations in Moscow, Charles University in Prague and Harvard Business School.

Alexander HUG is Principal Deputy Chief Monitor of the OSCE Special Monitoring Mission to Ukraine (SMM) since the inception of the SMM. Before being appointed to his current position, he was a Section Head and a Senior Adviser to the OSCE High Commissioner on National Minorities. Mr. Hug, a trained lawyer, served as an Officer in the Swiss Army, including a stint as the regional commander of the Swiss Headquarters Support Unit for the OSCE in northern Bosnia and Herzegovina. He also worked for the OSCE Mission in Kosovo, the Temporary International Presence in Hebron, and the EU Rule of Law Mission in Kosovo. Mr. Hug graduated from the Faculty of Law at the Fribourg University with a Master I degree in Law (LL.M) in 2000, and, subsequently, in 2005 he obtained a Master II degree in Law (LL.M) from the Faculty of Criminal Law and Human Rights at the King's College, University of Aberdeen.

Andy HUNDER is President of the American Chamber of Commerce in Ukraine. Mr. Hunder is a native Londoner, who over the past two decades has become a recognised leading specialist in Public Affairs, Communications and Government Relations in Ukraine. On April 15, 2015 he was appointed President of the American Chamber of Commerce in Ukraine. In 1997 Mr. Hunder was a TV presenter on a leading Ukrainian television channel. For seven years he headed the Public Relations department at Ukrainian Mobile Communications (now Vodafone Ukraine) and in 2004 was appointed External Affairs and Communications Manager at GlaxoSmithKline with responsibility for Ukraine, Central Asia and the Caucasus. He later launched the London office of Ukrainian law firm Magisters and later Sayenko Kharenko, where he also headed the Government Relations practice. The Ukrainian law firms in London served as conduits to service multinational clients investing in Ukraine. In 2010 Mr. Hunder was appointed as the Director of the Ukrainian Institute in London and was a regular commentator on Ukrainian current affairs in the global media. During 2014 he was interviewed live more than 100 times on top international TV and Radio stations, including the BBC, CNN, Sky News, Bloomberg TV, ITV, Al Jazeera and others. He has spoken on Ukrainian current affairs issues at the Houses of Parliament, House of Lords, Oxford University, London School of Economics and University College London. Mr. Hunder studied Philosophy and Theology in Rome, Italy. He speaks fluent English, Ukrainian, Russian and Italian. Andy is married and with his wife has two sons.

Maria IONOVA is a Member of the Parliament of Ukraine. Ms. Ionova began her political career in 2005 as a consultant at the Presidential Administration. From 2008 to 2012, she served as a member of the Kyiv City Council. Ms. Ionova was elected to the Verkhovna Rada in 2012, and reelected during the snap elections in 2014. She has consistently worked on the issues of European integration as Deputy Chair of the Committee on European Integration. In addition, Ms. Ionova is a substitute member of the Ukrainian delegation to PACE and a member of the EU-Ukraine Parliamentary Association Committee. Together with her colleagues from the Equal Opportunities Inter-Faction Union, she has been working on legislation to promote women's rights, preventing and combating domestic violence, and protecting children. During the war in the East of Ukraine, Ms. Ionova has strived to enhance the observance of the rights of internally displaced persons, particularly, women and children, through the advancement of Ukraine's legislation. Furthermore, she regularly joins European partners in visiting the contact line zone in Eastern Ukraine. Ms. Ionova also cooperates with volunteers who collect and deliver humanitarian aid to the war-affected areas. She received her MA in Public Administration from the National Academy for Public Administration under the President of Ukraine.

Luc JACOBS is Ambassador of Belgium to Ukraine who presented his credentials to President Petro Poroshenko on 11 September 2014. Prior to his assignment in Ukraine he was Director for Economic and Monetary Union, European Budget and European Social, Environmental and Cohesion Policy at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Brussels. Ambassador Jacobs entered the Foreign Service in 1986. He was assigned as Deputy Head of Mission in Dublin (1988-1991), Ottawa (1991-1995) and Prague (1995-1999) before returning to Brussels on a first home posting as Head of Unit for bilateral relations with the then EU-candidate countries (1999-2002). During the Belgian Presidency of the EU in the second half of 2001 he was also in charge of the negotiations leading up to the EU-Ukraine summit in Yalta and the EU-Russia summit in Brussels. From 2002 until 2007 Ambassador Jacobs held various positions at the Permanent Representation of Belgium to the EU, interrupted for one year when serving as an Advisor to the Belgian Secretary of State for European Affairs. In 2007-2011 he served as a Consul-General in Casablanca. Taras KACHKA is Deputy Executive Director of the International Renaissance Foundation, expert in international law, has extensive experience in the private sector, international organizations and government, where he negotiated on behalf of Ukraine the Association Agreement with the European Union. In 2014-2015, Mr. Kachka held the position of Vice President of Strategic Development at the American Chamber of Commerce in Ukraine. In 2011 he headed the Department of Foreign Economic Relations of the Ministry of Agrarian Policy and Food of Ukraine. He has also worked in the Department for Legal Approximation of the Ministry of Justice of Ukraine. Mr. Kachka graduated from the National School of Public Administration in Warsaw (Poland) and Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv with a Master's degree in International Law.

Satu KAHKONEN is the World Bank Country Director for Belarus, Moldova, and Ukraine as of July 25, 2016. Laurynas KASCIUNAS is a Member of the Parliament of Lithuania with the Homeland Union – Lithuanian Christian Democrats Party (since October 2016). He sits on the parliamentary Committee on National Security and Defense. Mr. Kasčiūnas studied at Vilnius University and holds a Doctorate Degree in Political Science (2012). Prior to that, he worked as a lecturer at the Institute of International Relations and Political Science of Vilnius University, and held a position of a Foreign Policy Advisor to the Speaker of the Lithuanian Parliament. In addition, in 2012-2016, he also served as Director of the Eastern Europe Studies Centre. Having the wealth of political experience, Mr. Kasčiūnas has set the consolidation and strengthening of the Lithuanian political and military stance as his main political goal. Peter KEREKGYARTO has been appointed as General Director of Shell Retail Ukraine in April 2016. Until her current appointment she worked with the ITT Investment group as the President and CEO of the ITT-Invest, one of the leading Ukrainian investment houses. In 2015, Ms. Markarova started her career in public sector as a Deputy Minister of Finance and Chief of Staff and subsequently was appointed as the First Deputy Minister of Finance. In addition, on 8 August, 2016 the Prime Minister named Ms. Markarova a Government Commissioner on Investments. In that capacity she already instituted the UkraineInvest office with a view to investment promotion. She is a member of the Supervisory Boards of all state banks, i.e. Oshadbank, Eximbank, Ukgazbank and PryvatBank.

Barbora MARONKOVA was appointed Director of the NATO Information and Documentation Centre in Ukraine since March 2017. Ms. Maronkova joined NATO's Public Diplomacy Division in Brussels, Belgium in 2006 as program coordinator to oversee projects that aim to raise awareness and promote NATO in a number of NATO member states. As of September 2010, she works as programme manager and is responsible for designing, planning and implementing public diplomacy campaigns in the Western Balkans. She actively works on NATO's Partnerships and Open door policies. In this capacity, she advises candidate countries on their national public awareness campaigns on NATO membership. As of 2012, she co-leads the Evaluation and Assessment program for the Division. Previously, Ms. Maronkova worked for a private airline company, Sky Europe Airlines on a number of projects including internal communications. In 2003, she established and headed a Slovak-based NGO Centre for European and North Atlantic Affairs to contribute to public and academic debate on Slovakia's membership in the EU and NATO. Her work included public relations and media appearances, public speaking, donors and stakeholders relations as well as the management of the NGO. A graduate of the University of Economics of Bratislava, Slovak Republic, Ms. Maronkova is also an alumni of the CPD Summer Institute and holds a Public Affairs diploma from the Chartered Institute for Public Relations in the UK.

Yulia MARUSHEVSKA is a Ukrainian activist and former public servant, who has become well known internationally after starring in the viral YouTube video “I am a Ukrainian” filmed during the climax of the Euromaidan protests in early 2014. After President Yanukovych was ousted from power and fled the country, Ms. Marushevskaya was widely interviewed by news outlets around the world and invited to speak about the revolution in Europe, the US and Canada. Then, in 2015, she was invited to be a visiting scholar at Stanford University working closely with Larry Diamond, Francis Fukuyama and former US Ambassador to Russia Michael McFaul. Before the revolution, she obtained a PhD in Ukrainian literature at Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv. In July 2015, former president of Georgia Mikheil Saakashvili, the then governor of Odesa Oblast of Ukraine, appointed her as his deputy in the Odesa Regional Administration. In October of that year, Ms. Marushevskaya was appointed as Head of the Customs Office of Odesa, a notoriously corrupt port on the Black Sea. She resigned in November 2016, not long after the resignation of Saakashvili and the rest of his team. Ms. Marushevskaya joined them in their strong stance that there was no high-level political will in support of the necessary reforms. After resigning she returned to public service, first with the “Help Hot Line” project which has provided legal support to businesses that witness corruption and pressure from the State Fiscal Service. She has recently launched a new NGO to work in the field of regional development and civic education.

Roman MASELKO is Attorney at Law, member of the NGO “Automaidan” Board, and Head of the Civil Oversight Council of the National Anti-corruption Bureau of Ukraine. He also holds membership in the Public Integrity Council and is an expert on judicial reform with the Reanimation Package of Reforms (RPR) initiative. Mr. Maselko is the co-founder of the NGO “Advocacy Advisory Panel” which monitors investigation of Maidan cases. He graduated from the Ivan Franko National University of Lviv in 2001 and received the license of attorney at law in 2012. In 2015, Mr. Maselko finished Ukrainian School of Political Studies (the project of the Council of Europe). In 2003-2016, he worked as a lawyer and head of the legal department at the “ProCredit Bank”. Since 2016, Mr. Maselko has been mainly engaged in public activities. During the Revolution of Dignity he participated pro bono in the organization of legal protection of protesters. In addition, for more than three years, he has been conducting proceedings to punish those judges and law enforcers guilty of persecuting activists during the Revolution of Dignity. Mr. Maselko has directly taken part in the development of Ukraine’s judicial reform and has been an advocate of the judiciary renewal and creation of a new Supreme Court in Ukraine.

Pablo MATEU is the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) Representative in Ukraine. Having worked for more than 25 years with the UNHCR, Mr. Mateu has served in nine countries and the agency's Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. His field experience includes camp-based refugee situations (Algeria, Mauritania, Mexico), reintegration of returnees (Afghanistan, Central America, Mozambique) and IDPs (Bosnia & Herzegovina). He also served as the UNHCR Representative in Algiers (2008-2009). At HQ level, his experience was related to linking humanitarian assistance with development, inter-agency cooperation, livelihoods, and durable solutions. Before coming to Ukraine, he worked on independent oversight, assessing the quality of UNHCR operations management around the world. Prior to joining UNHCR, Mr. Mateu worked as a consultant for the International Labour Organization and founded a national non-governmental organization in his native country (El Salvador) which specializes in micro-finance and local-level development. He completed his undergraduate and graduate university studies in the United States of America (Tulane University and the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill).

Svitlana MATVIENKO is Chairwoman of the Board of the Agency for Legislative Initiatives. She studied Theoretical and Practical Philosophy at the National University of “Kyiv-Mohyla academy” and Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv. She has a ten-year experience of working in the third sector and public bodies. Ms. Matviienko is an author of numerous publications. She is also in charge of leading Ukrainian think tank “Agency for Legislative Initiatives”, which implements the programs of the Ukrainian School of Political Studies. Ms. Matviienko is keen on literature and history of art.

Daniel MAYDANIK is Chairman of the Board of the Association of Gas Producers of Ukraine since December 2015. The Association of Gas Producers of Ukraine incorporates seven largest gas producing companies of Ukraine – UkrGasVydobuvannya, DTEK Neftgaz, Burisma Group, Geo Alliance Group, Smart Energy, KUB-Gaz and Poltava Petroleum Company. Mr. Maydanik studied at Kyiv National Economic University in 1994-1998 where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree with honors in Economics and a Master's Degree in Business Management. From 1998 to 2001 Mr. Maydanik worked as an expert certified by the State Property Fund of Ukraine in cost evaluation and management consulting. In 2001 he started his career as an auditor and financial consultant with Deloitte, one of the "Big Four" accounting firms. Soon afterwards Mr. Maydanik was appointed as a top executive manager. In 2007-2009 he became Deputy CFO with Interpipe, one of the largest steel pipe and railway wheel producers in the world. Since 2009 up to the present day Mr. Maydanik has been the Head of Corporate Finance and Investment Management Department, and representative of the EastOne Group Board of Directors, where, in particular, he is in charge of oil and gas domains.

Igor MAZEPA is Chief Executive Officer at Concorde Capital LLC, the leading investment bank in Ukraine. Mr. Mazepa started his business career in 1997 at Prospect Investments, a Russian-American investment company. In 2000, he was appointed as Managing Director at Foyil Securities New Europe. In 2002-2004, Mr. Mazepa served as Managing Director of MFK (Interregional Financial Company). In 2004, he founded Concorde Capital, and in less than a year, Mr. Mazepa successfully turned his company into one of the leading players on the Ukrainian stock market, becoming the leader on Ukraine's PFTS based on turnover by December. Today Concorde Capital is a leading Ukrainian brokerage which has been ranked among the top investment banking service providers in Ukraine, Russia and other CIS countries, according to the research of Thomson Reuters, the largest international information agency. Mr. Mazepa held various senior positions in high-profile companies serving as the Chairman of the Board of the Ukrainian Exchange (UX) (2008 – 2016), Supervisory Board Member of PJSC "Alfa-Bank" Ukraine during 2014 and Supervisory Board Member of JSC Ukreximbank Ukraine (2014 –2016). From November 2016 and until now he is a member of the Supervisory Board of PJSC "UkrSotsbank". Mr. Mazepa holds a Master's degree in International Business Administration and in Law from Kyiv National Economic University.

Alastair McBAIN is Managing Director at Arawak Energy. He is a graduate of Oxford University and has over 37 years' experience in the oil industry. He spent the first seventeen years of his career with Shell in numerous senior international postings including assignments in Singapore, Dubai, China and Venezuela. Prior to leaving Shell, he worked in their natural gas business with specific responsibility for the development of LNG projects. He joined the Vitol group in 1995 to head up the growth of the group's portfolio of upstream assets and became the CEO of Arawak Energy in September 2002. Arawak was listed in Toronto and was admitted to the LSE in July 2008 before being privatized in 2009, becoming a wholly owned subsidiary of the Vitol Group, the world's largest independent energy trading company. Arawak acquired its initial stake in Geo-Alliance, a leading independent Ukrainian oil and gas group in August 2012, where Mr. McBain serves as Chairman of the Board. In addition to Ukraine, Arawak and the Vitol Group explore for, develop and produce oil and gas from blocks in Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, the USA, Mexico, Ghana, Cote d'Ivoire and the UAE. Current equity production is over 9000 BOE/D.

Oleksiy MELNYK is the Co-Director of Foreign Relations and International Security Programmes at the Razumkov Centre (the Ukrainian Centre for Economic and Political Studies), Ukraine. Before joining the Razumkov Centre, he served as the Head of Organizational and Analytical Division and as the First Assistant to the Minister of Defence of Ukraine and also worked for SC “Ukroboronservice”. In addition, Mr. Melnyk served in the Air Forces (Lt Col. Ret.) for 21 years and, during his military career, participated in the UN peacekeeping operations (UNTAES). He studied International Relations and Security at the Royal College of Defence Studies, London, UK (2007). Dr. Marie Mendras was educated at Sciences Po in Paris and Johns Hopkins University-SAIS.

Yaroslav MENDUS is Political Advisor to the Vice-President of the EU Parliament Ioan Mircea Pascu. Mr. Mendus was the Member of the Parliament of Ukraine of V convocation. He worked as Vice-Head of the Office of Domestic Policy in the Administration of Leonid Kravchuk, the First President of Ukraine (1991-1994) and as Advisor to the Head of the Parliament of Ukraine (1994-1998). Later, he served as Advisor to Member of the European Parliament Marek Siwiec and then as Political Advisor to the Vice-Chair of the Committee on Foreign Affairs in the European Parliament. Mr. Mendus was also the General Producer of the movie “The Orange Sky” – a love story, set against the backdrop of the 2004-2005 Orange Revolution. Ainars MEŽULIS is a Member of the Latvian Parliament (since 2014) and serves as Chairman of the Group for Inter-Parliamentary Relations with Ukraine. He also sits as Secretary on the Public Administration and Local Government Committee. Mr. Mežulis has rich experience in governance as he previously discharged the functions of the Smiltene town (2001-2009) and regional (2009-2014) councils. Mr. Mežulis was born in Smiltene in 1962. Rūta MILIŪTĖ is Coordinator of the Lithuanian Farmers and Greens Union Political Group. In 2016, Ms. Miliūtė was elected to the Seimas of the Republic of Lithuania. Since then, she has been a member of several committees, subcommittees and commissions, namely, the Committee on European Affairs, Committee on Foreign Affairs, Subcommittee on Transatlantic Relations and Democratic Development, Commission for Ethics and Procedures and the Commission for Youth and Sport Affairs. Prior to becoming an MP, she worked as project coordinator at the public company AB TEO. From 2014 to 2015 she held the position of Marketing Manager at the daily newspaper Kauno Diena. Ihor MITIUKOV is the Senior Advisor to Morgan Stanley, the company with which he has been working since 2008. Mr. Mitiukov attained many accomplishments successively serving as the Deputy Governor of the National Bank of Ukraine and Vice-Prime Minister of Ukraine for Banking and Finance (1994-1995). In 1995-1997, Mr. Mitiukov was Ukraine's Special Representative (with the Vice-Prime Ministerial status) to the European Union in Brussels. From 1997 to 2001 he was the Minister of Finance of Ukraine and, under his leadership, Ukraine entered the international capital markets in 1997. Mr. Mitiukov enriched his diplomatic background serving as the Ukrainian Ambassador to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland in 2002-2005. From 2007 to 2016 he was the Independent Director of the Board, Ferrexpo PLC, London. Subsequently, he was appointed as the Chairman of Supervisory Board of the National Depository of Ukraine. Alex MUNTEANU is Founder and Managing Partner at 4i Capital Partners. He has been making private equity transactions and overseeing companies in Ukraine, Belarus and Moldova for 20 years. She was among the co-founders of the Reanimation Package of Reforms civil platform after Euromaidan. In 2009, Ms. Nechyporenko was engaged in launching the activity of Edinburgh Business School in Ukraine. She holds a Master's degree in Political Sciences from Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv and is currently undertaking British MBA at Edinburgh Business School.

Maksym NEFODOV is the Deputy Minister of Economic Development and Trade of Ukraine (since February 2015). Prior to joining the Ministry of Economic Development and Trade of Ukraine, Mr. Nefodov worked for Icon Private Equity fund (2010) as the Managing Director of the Ukrainian office and in 2011 he became the Managing Partner of the fund. In 2006-2010, he worked for the Dragon Capital investment company where he held the position of Vice-President for Investment Banking. Previously, Mr. Nefodov served as an M&A Analyst at Golden Gate Business, Ukraine. He has profound expertise in such fields as public procurements, project management, technical regulation, international programs coordination and foreign economic activity.

ANTI/AIDS Foundation has cooperated with Clinton HIV/AIDS Initiative, Elton John AIDS Foundation and Global Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS. Elena is a daughter of the second President of Ukraine Leonid Kuchma. Elena also chairs the Supervisory Board of StarLightMedia, the biggest media holding in Ukraine. StarLightMedia supports campaigns against AIDS and so far has invested 80 million dollars in combating AIDS.

Oleksandr POCHKUN is the founder and managing partner of the company “Baker Tilly Ukraine” which is a member of the international network Baker Tilly International. He has over 18 years of experience in providing audit services, project management, due diligence, tax and financial consulting. Mr. Pochkun graduated from Kyiv National Economic University majoring in Financial Management and successfully completed the Leadership Program course at the University of Chicago Booth School of Business. Mr. Pochkun has a solid reputation being a Certified Auditor (the Certificate of the Audit Chamber of Ukraine) and Certified Accounting Practitioner (the CAP Certificate). He also holds membership in the Regional EMEA Advisory Council and Public Sector Committee within the frameworks of the Baker Tilly International network as well as in the East Europe Foundation Board. Mr. Pochkun is an initiator and Vice-President of the SUP (Union of Ukrainian Entrepreneurs). He is married and has four sons.

Richard James POLLARD is the Managing Partner of PwC in Ukraine resident in Kyiv. Starting from 2012 he has been a member of the PwC's CEE Regional Leadership Team. Mr. Pollard has 34 years' experience with PwC, of which 22 years he has been the company's Partner. Mr. Pollard has had formal secondments to Paris, Tokyo, and Moscow. Throughout his career most of Mr. Pollard's client work has been on multinational clients, especially in the oil and gas sector. In addition, he has led PwC's Global Development function for three years. Mr. Pollard is a graduate in Law from Oxford University, and is a fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW).

Alina POLYAKOVA is the Director of Research for Europe and Eurasia at the Atlantic Council in Washington, DC. Arnoldas PRANCKEVIČIUS is Head of the European Commission Representation in Lithuania. Oleg PROKHORENKO is CEO and Chairman of the Board of UkrGasVydobuvannya (UGV) since June 2015. UGV is Ukraine's largest natural gas producer, with ~15 bcm pa of production (~75% of Ukraine's total), and one of the largest companies in Ukraine. Prior to UGV, Mr. Prokhorenko spent almost 8 years as associate principal, engagement manager and consultant with McKinsey & Company in Kyiv, Ukraine and Dubai, OAE. At McKinsey he worked with largest private companies and significant state institutions in oil and gas, power generation, metals and mining, and public sector on strategy development, operational improvement, and organization restructuring. Ivan PRYMACHENKO is a co-founder of the non-profit Ukrainian massive open online courses platform Prometheus. In that capacity he leads strategy and courses development, manages partnerships and PR relationships. Within last 30 months, Mr. Prymachenko increased the number of registered students to 400,000 and the number of unique visitors to 2,500,000. He also oversaw the launch of more than 50 free courses taught by leading Ukrainian institutions, including Taras Shevchenko, National Technical, and Ukrainian Catholic universities and translation of world's top MOOCs by Harvard and Stanford into Ukrainian. Mr. Prymachenko worked directly with government representatives to launch classes on procurement management taught by Ministry of Economic Development officials. He negotiated and managed relationships with key stakeholders, including the OSCE, Council of Europe, Microsoft Ukraine, and EY Ukraine. In addition, he introduced a national blended learning pilot in collaboration with top Ukrainian universities, making Prometheus courses mandatory and a part of the curriculum at eleven universities. Mr. Prymachenko was awarded People of the New Age Award provided by "Novoye Vremia" Magazine and Kyiv Post Top 30 Under 30 Award in 2016, and Forbes Ukraine 30 Under 30 Award in 2015.

Vadym PRYSTAIKO is the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs and Chief of Staff at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine. He started his public career in 1994 joining the Ministry of Foreign Economic Relations and Trade of Ukraine where he held the posts of Economist, Head of Division, and Deputy Head of the Department of Trade and Economic Relations (Africa, Asia and Pacific Region). In 1997, Ambassador Prystaiko started to work at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine as the Deputy Head of Division (Asia and Pacific Region), Fifth Territorial Directorate General. He has extensive diplomatic experience gained when serving as Consul at the Consulate General of Ukraine in Sydney, Australia (2000-2001); Consultant of the Foreign Policy Directorate at the Administration of the President of Ukraine (2001-2002); Political Counselor and Chargé d'Affaires of Ukraine to Canada (2002-2006); Deputy Director of NATO Directorate General at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine (2007-2009), and Minister-Counselor and DCM at the Embassy of Ukraine to the USA (2009-2012). In 2012 he was appointed as the Ambassador of Ukraine to Canada and discharged those functions until 2014. Ambassador Prystaiko is a graduate of Kyiv Polytechnic Institute (1994) and also holds a Master's degree from the Ukrainian Academy of Foreign Trade (1998). He is married and has two sons. Ambassador Prystaiko is fluent in English and Russian.

Victoria PTASHNYK is a member of the Ukrainian Parliament, member of the Committee on Economic Policy, member of the Constitution Committee of Ukraine, and of the Judicial Reform Advisory Council under the President of Ukraine. She is a co-founder of the inter-faction group “EuroOptimists”, a group of the newly elected and reform-directed MPs. Prior to being elected to the Parliament, Ms. Ptashnyk had more than ten years of experience in the legal field. As a former antitrust lawyer, she pushes the competition reform in the Parliament. She is an author of parts of the Coalition Agreement, dedicated to the antitrust reform. Valery PUSHNYA is with Credit Suisse from March 2010 as a Managing Director and Head of Fixed Income department with responsibility to cover Local Currency EMEA Russia and CIS products range such as Bonds, Rates and FX trading. Mr. Pushnya joined Credit Suisse in March 2010 from Deutsche Bank where he worked as a Managing Director covering Rates and FX trading in Russia and CIS, acting as a Head of Treasury. While being with Deutsche Bank he rebuilt the fixed income business in Russia and CIS after the loss of the whole team to VTB, hired and managed a team of ten responsible for FX, Rates, Bonds and options trading in the region. Team's PNL in 2009 was EUR 270. Prior to this, Mr. Pushnya worked for Merrill Lynch International in the London office in 2007 and 2008 as a Director and Head of Local Markets Trading Russia and CIS. During his work at ML he started Russia FICC business in ML Russia. He hired and managed a team of six, managed FX options book for Russia and CIS and developed local clients business in exotic derivatives. Before that he was with Deutsche Bank in Russia from 2004 as a Director and Head of Local Markets derivatives Russia and CIS. His aim was to start local markets derivatives business for Deutsche Bank and establish them as a premier market maker in RUB FX options which he achieved successfully. He also developed local franchise in options linked structured products and initiated trading in exotic FX derivatives and hybrid structures. Prior to this, Mr. Pushnya worked for two years at NIKOIL in Russia as a Director and a Head of Debt Capital Markets with responsibilities for driving the investment banking arm of Lukoil, Russia's largest oil company, to a premier position in local debt origination: started DCM business in Nikoil with first public debt issues for energy and construction companies and first structured bonds issues on Russian bond market. Vladyslav RASHKOVAN is an Alternative Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund (IMF) representing Ukraine and fourteen other states on the IMF Executive Board. Prior to joining the IMF, Mr. Rashkovan served as Deputy Governor and a Member of the Board of the National Bank of Ukraine (NBU) being responsible for the development and implementation of the strategy for the Ukrainian banking sector reforms and a turnaround transformation project within the National Bank of Ukraine. Before joining the NBU in 2014, Mr. Rashkovan spent eight years working with the UniCredit Group, holding the position of CFO and Deputy CEO of UniCredit Bank Ukraine. Previously, in 2000, Mr. Rashkovan served as a strategic consultant in M&A field. Mr. Rashkovan has been widely engaged in non-profit activities having co-chaired the Banking and Financial Committee of the American Chamber of Commerce in Ukraine in 2010-2013 and having set on the Board of the Kyiv School of Economics in 2012-2014. Ernst REICHEL is Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Federal Republic of Germany to Ukraine since August 2016. He was born in 1960 in Lagos, Nigeria. He studied Law at the University of Bonn from which he received a Doctorate. In 1988, Dr. Reichel joined the German Foreign Service. His first assignment abroad took him to Leningrad (St. Petersburg) in 1990. From 1992 to 1996 he occupied the position of a political desk officer for Russia. From 1996, Ambassador Reichel served for three years the German Permanent Representation to the United Nations in New York. Following this he worked in the International Law Division of the German Foreign Office. From 2000 to 2003 he was the Deputy Head of Division for EU Policy and Institutional Issues. Then Dr. Reichel served as Deputy Director in the Private Office of the NATO Secretary General. In 2007 he started to head the Division for Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, Moldova and Eastern Partnership in the German Foreign Office. In 2011 he became Ambassador in Pristina, Kosovo. In 2013 Ambassador Reichel was assigned the post of Special Envoy for South Eastern Europe, Turkey and the EFTA states.

Bojana J. REINER is Associate Director for Policy Engagements and Grants Adviser at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), based in London. In this role, Ms. Reiner oversees the delivery of key reform policy engagements across EMEA (including the Ukraine Reforms Support Architecture) and deployment of around €100 million donor funds annually. Previously, she was Adviser to the EBRD Chief Economist, responsible for development and implementation of the Office of the Chief Economist's strategy and priorities concerning public policy, government affairs and stakeholder relations with key decision-makers across the EBRD region of operations. She joined the EBRD in 2006 from Kroll Associates, where she was Intelligence and Investigations Consultant, responsible for investigations of business interests, political connections and corporate relationships. Prior to working at Kroll, she spent seven years as News Writer and Presenter at BBC and previously worked as Legislative Adviser at the US Congress in Washington DC. Ms. Reiner holds a First class Master's degree in International Law, and a BA in International Relations and Economics. She is proficient in six languages.

Sir **Malcolm Leslie RIFKIND** KCMG QC is a British politician who served in various roles as a cabinet minister under Prime Ministers Margaret Thatcher and John Major. He became a member of the Cabinet in 1986 as Secretary of State for Scotland. In 1992 he was appointed Secretary of State for Defence, and in 1995-97 he held the post of Foreign Secretary. He was one of only four ministers to serve throughout the terms of Prime Ministers Margaret Thatcher and John Major. In 1997 he was knighted in recognition of his public service. Sir Malcolm served as UK representative on the Commonwealth Eminent Persons Group 2010-2011 and as Chairman of the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament, which provides oversight of the UK's intelligence agencies from 2010 until 2015. He is currently a member of the OSCE's Eminent Persons Group which is to report on relations between Russia and the West. Sir Malcolm has also served a Visiting Professor at King's College, London, since 2015.

Lord RISBY is the Chairman of the British Ukrainian Society. He was elected as the Conservative MP for Bury St. Edmunds in 1992-1997, for West Suffolk in 1997-2010, and raised to the peerage in 2010. Lord Risby was appointed by David Cameron, at first, as the Vice Chairman of the Conservative Party & Co-Chairman of the Conservative City Circle in 2005-2010 and later as the Prime Ministerial Trade Envoy for Algeria Governor from the end of 2012 until present. He acted as the Director of the Westminster Foundation for Democracy in 2003-2009 and as the Co-Chairman of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on Ukraine in 2012-2014. As for his prior parliamentary career, Lord Risby was the Deputy Chairman of the Small Business Bureau & Chairman of the Small Business Bureau Parliamentary Advisory Group (1995), Parliamentary Private Secretary in the Northern Ireland Office at the Department of Trade & Industry and at the Ministry of Defense (1993-1997), Shadow Frontbench Spokesman for Culture, Media & Sport (appointed 1997), Shadow Minister for Foreign & Commonwealth Affairs (2000-2004), Shadow Minister for Financial Services (2004) and Shadow Paymaster General (thereafter until December 2005). Prior to this, he was also the VP of Merrill Lynch (1976-1986), Deputy MD of E F Hutton Int'l Assoc. (1986), Executive Director of Shearson Lehman Hutton (1988) and MD of Furman Selz (1989). Lord Risby studied at Cape Town University, Rondebosch, and subsequently at the Magdalene College, University of Cambridge, where he received an MA in Economics.

Pavlo RIZANENKO is a Member of the Parliament of Ukraine where he serves as Deputy Chairman of Special Control Commission on Privatization, sits on the Financial Policy and Banking Committees and is a member of the Petro Poroshenko Bloc faction. He also holds membership in the Interfactional Association "EuroOptimists". Mr. Rizanenko has started his professional career as a senior auditor at the audit company Ernst & Young. In 1999, after becoming an investment banker, he has moved to the Russian Federation where he worked with an investment company "Troika Dialog", and later with an investment company "Renaissance Capital" being responsible for deals in the mining and metal industries. Mr. Rizanenko also was a member of the Board of Directors of "VSMPO-AVISMA Corporation" (Russia), an international leader in production of titanium. In 2010, he was elected to the local city council and subsequently to the Verkhovna Rada. Mr. Rizanenko was a Member of the Budget Committee (2012-2014) working mostly with state budget and state debt. Mr. Rizanenko has graduated from Graceland College (USA). He also has received an international professional certificate of Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA).

Berel RODAL is a founder and Board Director of the Ukrainian Jewish Encounter (UJE) Initiative, and Chair of the Advisory Board. He provides strategic advice and related services to clients in the private and public sectors. He sits as a Partner, Advisor to or Board Member of various growth-oriented, innovative investment and technology enterprises, NGOs, and think-tanks in North America, Europe, and Asia. His professional experience as a senior official in the Government of Canada for twenty years included policy-making, planning, and executive responsibilities in the foreign affairs, international trade, defense, security, economic, and social domains. He was a Member of Canada's Negotiating Team for the Canada-US Free Trade Agreement, the precursor of NAFTA, the largest agreement of such nature ever concluded. Mr. Rodal holds degrees from McGill and Oxford Universities. He started working with Mobil EP Dallas research center where he investigated seismic acquisition and processing, and later was assigned to Latin America new exploration ventures. In Latin America he has been Argentina EP Manager for Mobil and Bolivia Country Manager for ExxonMobil Exploration. He is also President of a non-governmental Center for Strategic Studies and Analysis and Head of a civil organization “Syla i Chest” (SICH) (“Strength and Honour”). In 2004, Dr. Smeshko was awarded the ranks of Ambassador Extraordinary and of Colonel-General (Honourable Colonel-General since 2005). Dr. Smeshko obtained his Master’s degrees in Radioelectronics from the Air Defense Military Academy (1977), in State Defense Management from the National Defense University of Ukraine (2000), Master’s degree in Law (2002) from Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv and Honorary Master’s degree from the Joint Intelligence College of the National Defense University of Ukraine (1998). Yakiv SMOLII is Acting Governor of the National Bank of Ukraine since May 2017. In October 2016, Mr. Smolii was appointed as First Deputy Governor of the National Bank of Ukraine and from April 2014 until that time, he worked as Deputy Governor of the National Bank of Ukraine. From 2006 to 2014, he was Director on Banking Business, Prestige-Group, and from 2005 to 2006, Consultant at Office Stolychnyi CJSC and Prestige-Group. Mr. Smolii holds a Degree in Applied Mathematics attained in 1983 from Ivan Franko Lviv State University. He also holds a PhD in Economics. Mr. Smolii was in 1961 in Verbovets village (Ternopil oblast). He is married and has two daughters. Mr. Smolii is fluent in English.

Michael SPEKTOR has proven himself to be a successful and effective businessman, leader and manager in various fields of business. Since October 2015, he is President at Forbes and Manhattan Ukraine LLC, a management and investment company active in the fields of metallurgical products trade, engineering, real estate development, gold mining, IT, and scientific research on the increase of mineral fertilizers productivity for the solution of global hunger problem. He has successfully managed and represented VS Energy International in 2005-2015 as President and CEO. VS Energy International is a corporation which operates over 30% of the Ukrainian energy market, owns and manages hotels in Ukraine and abroad and supervises the functioning of PJSC “First Investment Bank”, real estate projects, and agricultural facilities. Mr. Spektor supported the creation and now leads “Open Hearts Charity Foundation of Ukraine” which assists children in need, talented youth and people in difficult life situations. For his professional achievements and charitable activities, Mr. Spektor was honoured with various awards, such as State Award of the President of Ukraine (III degree, 2009); “Leader of the Industry” Award of the Ministry of Fuel and Energy of Ukraine (2009); and the Order of Merit of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church.

Maryna STAVNIICHUK is a lawyer. She served as a Member of European Commission for Democracy through Law (Venice Commission) (2009-2013). Ms. Stavniichuk holds a Candidate of Juridical Science and has been awarded the Honored Lawyer of Ukraine. In 1999 she was appointed as a Member of the Central Election Commission, and then was elected as Deputy Chairman of the Central Election Commission. In 2007 she became the Deputy Head of the Presidential Administration of Ukraine – Presidential Representative to the Constitutional Court of Ukraine and to the Central Election Commission, and worked as Head of the Main Office of the Constitutional and Legal Modernization of the Presidential Administration. In 2015, during the war, crisis and absence of financing, Mr. Stavnitser and his team signed a deal with Cargill to build a four-million-ton grain terminal with EBRD/IFC aboard. The project costs over 150 million USD. Mr. Stavnitser studied Commerce in Harrow House School, United Kingdom. He obtained a degree in International Business from the University Montana, Zug, Switzerland, and a degree in Executive MBA from HCMS French Institute, Moscow. He also holds a degree in Management from Mechnikov Odessa National University, Ukraine.

Dominique STRAUSS-KAHN, now Managing Partner of Parnasse International, is the 10th Managing Director of the International Monetary Fund (2007-2011). Previously, he served as a member of the French National Assembly and Professor of Economics at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques of Paris (2000-2007). He began his career as an Assistant Professor and later became a Professor of Economics at the University of Paris. Then, Dr. Strauss-Kahn was appointed as Deputy Commissioner of the Economic Planning Agency (1981-1986). Afterwards, he was elected for the first time to the National Assembly in 1986 and chaired the Finance Standing Committee of the House from 1988 to 1991. Dr. Strauss-Kahn has served as Minister of Industry and International Trade in the Cresson (1991-1992) and Beregovoy (1992-1993) cabinets. In 1995, he was elected as Mayor of the city of Sarcelles. From June 1997 to November 1999 Dr. Strauss-Kahn served as Minister of Economy, Finance and Industry of France in Jospin's cabinet. He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Paris. He also obtained degrees in Law (Paris X), Business Administration (HEC), Political Studies (IEP "Sciences Po", Paris) and Statistics (Institut de statistiques Paris VI).

Carl STURÉN is a Swedish investor in Ukraine, Founder and President of “Chumak” and “Vindkraft Ukraina”. In 1996, Swedish entrepreneurs Carl Sturén and Johan Bodén founded a food processing company “Chumak” in Southern Ukraine. Today “Chumak” is one of the country’s biggest food producers and a symbol of the Western investment success in Ukraine. In 2010, Mr. Sturén co-founded the company “Green Team”, which is the biggest vegetable cooling storage in Eastern Europe. In 2009, Mr. Sturén and his partners founded Vindkraft Ukraina, a Ukraine-based wind power development and investment company. Since 2000, Carl Sturén has been the Honorary Consul of Sweden in Ukraine.

Shigeki SUMI is Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan to Ukraine. Ambassador Sumi was born in Yokohama, Japan in June, 1953. In March 1977 he graduated from Hitotsubashi University, Department of Commerce and Management and later in July 1980 he received a Diploma of Social Studies from Oxford University. Ambassador Sumi began his professional career in April 1977, when he entered Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan. There he held various positions serving as Director of Policy Coordination Division, Foreign Policy Bureau (Aug 1993), Director at International Peace Cooperation Division, Foreign Policy Bureau (Feb 1994), Director of Oceania Division, European and Oceania Affairs Bureau (Feb 1996). In September 2005 Ambassador Sumi was appointed as Ambassador to the Permanent Mission of Japan to the International Organizations in Vienna, while being a Board Member of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. In August 2008 he headed the Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations. During 2009-2011 and 2013-2014 he was a Member of UN Committee on Contributions. Ambassador Sumi was decorated by an Order of Crown of Thailand, First Class in 2003 and Order of Bahrain, First Class in 2013.

Oleksandr SUSHKO is the Research Director of the Institute for Euro-Atlantic Cooperation in Kyiv, Ukraine, since 2006. He is also the Chair of the Board of the International Renaissance Foundation (IRF), Open Society Foundations network. Since 2014, Mr. Sushko has been managing the Secretariat of the Strategic Advisory Groups, an IRF-run project aimed at expert and advocacy support for reforms in Ukraine. He was a first Co-Chair of the EU-Ukraine Civil Society Platform (2015-2016), a bilateral institution established within the framework of the EU-Ukraine Association Agreement to facilitate civil society cooperation and policy impact. Mr. Sushko's areas of expertise include Ukraine, EU, International and Domestic Politics.

Alina SVIDERSKA is a Ukrainian lawyer, Member of the Board of the Professional Government Initiative (an organization uniting people with strong international education and experience) and President of the Cambridge Society of Ukraine. She completed her LLB degree at the National University of "Kyiv-Mohyla Academy" in Ukraine, and, thereafter, pursued her LLM at the University of Cambridge with a full Open Society Foundation scholarship. After her studies, Ms. Sviderska undertook an internship in the Liberty NGO in London working with the British Parliament on human rights legislation. Later she worked as a corporate lawyer for the international law firm Clifford Chance where Ms. Sviderska represented major international clients who entered the Ukrainian market. During the 2014 Revolution of Dignity she joined the Ministry of Economy working on the deregulation reform and became advisor to the Minister of Economy. At the same time, Ms. Sviderska became involved in the EasyBusiness NGO activities where she served as a Partner and focused on the oil and gas and energy issues as well as fundraising and general legal advice. At the moment she works in the green energy sector developing renewable business together with the Scandinavian partners and running NGOs (e.g. Clean Energy Lab) which promote popularisation of renewable energy.

Fredrik SVINHUFVUD has a farming background and is a Co-Founder and Partner of “Vindkraft Ukraina” and owner of “Vattenkraft Ukraina”, the companies which are active in the development and production of renewable energy in Ukraine. After having graduated from the Swedish Naval Academy and later from the Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm, Sweden, Fredrik started his civilian career as a field engineer with Schlumberger Oil Field Services and has later held several international positions within the same sector in both South- and North Americas, the North Sea and Russia with Schlumberger, Atlas Copco Oil & Gas, Geco Well Services and Malka Oil (publ.) respectively. In 1994, he became a Factory Manager and in 2001 – 2007, Mr. Svinhufvud served as Managing Director at Tetra Pak Ukraine. In March 2006, he was elected President of the European Business Association (EBA) in Ukraine. Fredrik is currently living in Kakhovka, Kherson Oblast, Ukraine, with his wife and their son.

Ivan SVITEK is Chief Executive Officer of Alfa-Bank (Ukraine) and UkrSotsbank. Prior to joining Alfa-Bank, Mr. Svitek has been a Chairman of the Board and CEO of Home Credit and Finance Bank in Russia. At this position he evolved the bank into a largest private retail lender and top-10 bank. In 2013 Mr. Svitek was named the Banker of the Year. Mr. Svitek also held a number of managing positions serving as President and Chief Executive Officer at GE Money, Brazil (2003-2008); European Pricing Leader at GE Consumer Finance HQ, Ireland (2001-2002); Chief Financial Officer and Vice-Chairman of the Board at GE Capital Bank, Czech Republic (1998-2001); Planning Manager and Financial Controller of Czech and Slovak Market Unit, Pepsi-Cola Company, Czech Republic (1996-1998); Financial Planning Manager of Eastern Europe HQ, Pepsi-Cola International, Austria (1994-1995); and Manager of Capital Markets Department, Citibank, Czech Republic (1993). In addition, in 1991-1992, he was an Advisor to the Minister of Finance, Czechoslovakia. Mr. Svitek holds a BA in Economics and Political Science from Claremont McKenna College, USA, and an MBA with specialization in Finance from INSEAD, France.

Yuliya SYCHIKOVA is co-founder of Ukraine Global Scholars, a non-profit organization aimed at supervising the admissions of top Ukrainian high school students to top US boarding school and universities. She has been a founder and team member of a number of startups in Ukraine and the United States of America. Ms. Sychikova won a full scholarship to the University of Pennsylvania where she pursued a Bachelor's degree in Economics. She is also a USA/USA program and Freedom Support Act scholar.

Artem SYTNYK is the Director of the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine. He personally investigated, or led investigation teams working on, more than 300 criminal proceedings initiated mostly regarding corruption-related crimes. Mr. Sytnyk started his career in 2001 as a district attorney assistant in Lenynskiy District, Kropyvnytsky (the former city of Kirovohrad) and later became an investigator. In April 2004, he was first appointed as a senior investigator of the Prosecutor's Office in Kirovohrad oblast, and, in October 2006, as the Head of Investigation Division in the Prosecutor's Office. In August 2008, Mr. Sytnyk was transferred to the Kyiv oblast Prosecutor's Office as Head of Investigation Division. In August 2011, he resigned because of his objections to the policies of the Yanukovich regime, criminalisation of law enforcement agencies, rollback in the fight against corruption, total incompetence and political bias on the part of the then Prosecutor General in Kyiv oblast. His investigation team effectively brought to justice many judges and officials of the Security Service of Ukraine, internal affairs agencies, tax police, boarder guard services, district state administrations, oblast councils, city councils, district councils, State Committees on land resources and water management, State Inspection on consumer rights protection, State Penitentiary Service and State Ecological Inspection for accepting bribes and committing other corruption-related crimes.

Viktor TARAN is a Ukrainian political analyst and the Head of the Centre «Eidos». This organization is dedicated to e-governance, political education, fight against corruption, and government transparency. Since 1995, Mr. Taran has been actively involved in social and political life of Ukraine. He was in senior positions in political youth organizations "Young People's Movement" and "Batkivshchyna Youth". He has been working in public central and local authorities for more than fifteen years and was twice elected as a member of local council. In 2010, Mr. Taran started his career in the civil society sector. He is a co-founder of the educational project "Higher Political School". From 2011, Mr. Taran has been involved as an expert in the Council of Europe Programme "Evaluation of Standards of Public Ethics" within the framework of the "Strengthening the institutional capacity of local authorities in Ukraine" project. In addition, Mr. Taran is a co-founder of the initiatives "CHESNO Civil Movement" and "The Reanimation Package of Reforms". He also continues to work with local authorities, where he advises on political ethics and anti-corruption. Currently, Mr. Taran is the Head of the Public Council of the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine. Furthermore, he was the initiator of creating the E-database that makes the allocation and spending of public funds open and authored of the Law "On openness of application of public funds".

Borys TARASYUK is a Member of the Parliament of Ukraine where he sits as Deputy Chairman on the Committee on Foreign Affairs. He is a Ukrainian diplomat and politician who served twice as the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine in five governments under two Presidents (1998-2000, 2005-2007). Since 2015, Mr. Tarasyuk has been Vice-President of the Euronest Parliamentary Assembly. He is the Founder and Director of the Institute for Euro-Atlantic Cooperation and Chairman of the Board of the "EuroAtlantica" magazine. Mr. Tarasyuk was the leader of a political party "Narodnyi Rukh" of Ukraine (People's Movement of Ukraine) from 2003 to 2012. At the moment, he is Deputy Head of All-Ukraine Union "Batkivshchyna" Party. Mr. Tarasyuk chairs the Inter-Factional Group "Ukraine in NATO". Previously, he was Head of the Parliamentary Committee for European Integration (2002-2005, 2006 and 2007-2012). Since 1975, he served at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine, and held membership in the Mission to the United Nations (1981-1986) and of the Delegation to the UN Security Council (1984-1985). Mr. Tarasyuk served as Ambassador of Ukraine to the Benelux countries from 1995 to 1998, and was the Head of the Mission of Ukraine to NATO from 1997 to 1998. In 1992, Mr. Tarasyuk received the rank of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary.

Serhiy TARUTA is a Ukrainian politician, businessman and philanthropist known for his long-standing support of Ukrainian cultural heritage projects. In 2014, Mr. Taruta was elected to the Parliament of Ukraine from the native city of Mariupol as an independent candidate. As a Member of Parliament, he chairs the Subcommittee on Cultural and Historical Preservation as well as two international committees on relations with Germany and Azerbaijan. Before the collapse of the Soviet Union, Mr. Taruta worked at one of the largest steel mills managing its export division. In the early 1990s, he established one of the first steel trading companies in the independent Ukraine. In 2001-2014, Mr. Taruta served as Chairman of the Board of ISD Corporation, one of the largest steel producers in Eastern Europe. In 2014, he assumed the position of a governor in the war-torn Donetsk oblast to assist the region in dealing with the humanitarian crisis. Due to his strong public standing on the issues of war in the East of Ukraine, the Russian state bank (VEB) arrested all of his industrial assets, including those of the ISD Corporation. Mr. Taruta is a collector of Christian Orthodox icons and literature. His private collection of items of the Trypillian culture, an ancient Neolithic civilization of Eastern Europe, is amongst the largest in the world. Mr. Taruta obtained his degree in Engineering from the Mariupol Technical University in 1979 and received an MBA from the Donetsk State Management Academy in 1999.

Tetyana TARUTA is Chief Executive Officer of Gdansk Shipyard Group SP.Z O.O. since September 2016. She has also been Vice-President of the Supervisory Board to GSG Towers SP.Z O.O. since December 2015. In addition, Ms. Taruta has been a Leading Analyst at Intef Capital, since September 2013. She served as Chief Specialist of the International Cooperation Department at the State Environmental Investment Agency of Ukraine from September 2010 to September 2012, and has been an Advisor to the Minister of Ecology and Natural Resources of Ukraine since January 2015. Ms. Taruta graduated from the London School of Economics and Political Science, London, United Kingdom, where she attained a Master's degree in Environmental Economics and Climate Change. She also graduated from Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv with Master's and Bachelor's degrees in International Economics with distinction. Ms. Taruta is fluent in Ukrainian, Russian and English, and is proficient in Spanish.

Yönet C. TEZEL is the Ambassador of Turkey to Ukraine since February 2014. Prior to this posting, he was the Deputy Director-General for Research in the Turkish Ministry of Foreign Affairs. His earlier assignments in the Ministry include the positions in the Policy Planning Directorate, in particular those of the President and the Minister. Ambassador Tezel was also part of the Turkish Delegation to the OSCE in Vienna, Turkish Consulate General in Jerusalem, and Turkish Embassy in London and Ottawa. He has a BA in Political Science from Boğaziçi University, Istanbul, and an MA in International Relations from Middle East Technical University, Ankara. During his time in London and Ottawa Ambassador Tezel also carried out academic studies. He is married and has three children.

Peter TILS is Chief Executive Officer for Central and Eastern Europe at Deutsche Bank since 2005. In addition, he is Chairman of the Supervisory Boards of OOO Deutsche Bank, Moscow, Deutsche Bank Polska S.A., PJSC Deutsche Bank DBU, Kyiv, and of the Board of Directors of Deutsche Bank A.S., Istanbul. Mr. Tils joined Deutsche Bank in 1977. Inter alia, he headed Deutsche Bank's Representative Office in Mexico City, and was Co-Head of Deutsche Bank's Göttingen Branch. He chaired the Bank Advisory Committee on Bulgaria's US\$ 10 billion foreign debt in the early 90s. Mr. Tils also led the team covering governments, central banks, financial institutions, and selected corporates in Central and Eastern Europe. During this time, he significantly contributed to building up Deutsche Bank's local presence in the region. Ms. Tkeshelashvili is also the President of the Georgian Institute for Strategic Studies, a non-profit think-tank which facilitates the understanding of political, security and foreign policy choices which have been or are to be taken by Georgia and a wider region and aims at contributing to the success of Georgia's integration in the Euro-Atlantic space. Ms. Tkeshelashvili is a lecturer at the Civil and Political School in Kyiv, Ukraine, and at the Black Sea University in Tbilisi, Georgia. She teaches courses on State Building, Transformational Leadership, European Studies and International Law. Ms. Tkeshelashvili has served in the government of Georgia as the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Secretary of the National Security Council, Minister of Justice of Georgia as well as the Prosecutor General of Georgia. In early 2017 she has been ranked among Top 100 successful Women of Ukraine. Her hobbies include photographing, volunteering and snowboarding. Ms. Tychkivska enjoys travelling and reading. She has a son.

Roman TYCHKIVSKYY manages the Economic Leadership Program through which Western NIS Enterprise Fund implements a series of projects, such as the Ukrainian Leadership Academy, SEED Grant, and the Corporate Governance Development Program. Mr. Tychkivskyy has a Bachelor's degree in Economics from the National University of "Kyiv-Mohyla Academy" and a Master's in Economy and Innovation from the Barcelona Graduate School of Economics. He was a co-founder of the Open University of Maidan during the Revolution of Dignity, managing the fundraising affairs. In 2005-2008, Mr. Tychkivskyy initiated a series of fundraising projects to help families with children suffering from oncological and neurological diseases. This allowed four children to undergo medical treatment abroad. He also worked as a coordinator for Canada-Ukraine Parliamentary Program which has been offering Ukrainian students the opportunity to undertake a three-month internship program in the Parliament of Canada. Furthermore, he was an assistant to Member of the Parliament of Canada Corneliu Chisu. In addition, Mr. Tychkivskyy has expertise in business consulting of foreign companies in Ukraine and is experienced in project management having worked at "IFEST" Holding of Emotions (Lviv), a network of conceptual restaurants and projects that promote tourist destinations.

Yulia TYMOSHENKO is the leader of “Batkivshchyna” political party and a former Prime Minister of Ukraine. In the end of 1996, Ms. Tymoshenko was elected to the Parliament of Ukraine for the first time. In 1999, she founded and chaired the All-Ukrainian Union Batkivshchyna. On December 30, 1999, Ms. Tymoshenko was appointed Deputy Prime Minister on fuel and energy issues. On February 13, 2001 she was arrested. The arrest was generally viewed as a punishment for her pro-democratic activity. In March 2001, the Kyiv Pecherskyi Court found the accusations to be groundless and released her. In November 2004, Ms. Tymoshenko became one of the leaders of the Orange Revolution, a democratic popular uprising in Ukraine that broke out as a protest against the rigged presidential elections. On February 4, 2005, the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine appointed Ms. Tymoshenko as the Prime Minister with the record 373 votes. In July 2005, the Forbes magazine named Prime Minister Tymoshenko the third most influential woman in the world. In 2007, she was awarded the Prize for Courage Politique by the Sorbonne Association de Politique Etrangere et Politique Internationale.

Mykhailo TYTARCHUK is Deputy Minister of Economic Development and Trade of Ukraine. He was born in Chernihiv and spent his youth in the city of Odesa. Mr. Tytarchuk graduated from the National University of State Tax Service in 2008 and holds a Master's degree in Law. Since 2007 until 2015, Mr. Tytarchuk worked as Project Manager of "Avia-Leasing LTD", Insurance Group "ABIKOC", and as Administration Manager of China National Gold & Gerald Metals Group SOREMI S.A. Republic of Congo. Since September 2015 until May 2016, he served as Head of the Bilhorod-Dnistrovskyi regional state administration. In June-December 2016 he was Deputy Minister of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine.

Gizo UGLAVA is the First Deputy Head of the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine. He was born in 1975 in Kutaisi, Georgia and obtained Ukrainian citizenship in 2015. Mr. Uglava graduated from the Ivane Javakhsishvili Tbilisi State University in 1998 with a degree in Law. He started his career in the prosecution system of Georgia in 1998 and worked there until 2012. On 11 February 2013 Mr. Uglava founded the “LEGAL CONSULTING AND SERVICES” law firm and practiced law there henceforth. During his service in the prosecution agencies of Georgia he received numerous state awards.

Andreas UMLAND is a German political scientist, historian and Russian interpreter, specializing in contemporary Russian and Ukrainian history. Dr. Umland held fellow- or lectureships at Stanford University, Harvard University, the University of Oxford, Urals State University, Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, Catholic University of Eichstaett, and National University of “Kyiv-Mohyla Academy”. Since 2014, he has been a Senior Research Fellow at the Institute for Euro-Atlantic Cooperation, Kyiv. Dr. Umland is a member of the Academic Advisory Council of the European Integration Committee of the Parliament of Ukraine, co-editor of the web-journal “Forum noveishei vostochnoevropeiskoi istorii i kultury” (“Forum of the contemporary history and culture”) and general editor of the book series “Soviet and Post-Soviet Politics and Society”.

Lesia VASYLENKO is the founder and Chairwoman of the non-governmental organization “Legal Hundred” (“Yurydychna Sotnya”) which provides free legal advice to Ukrainian soldiers and veterans, protects their rights and pushes for social reforms in the country. Before becoming an active leader within the NGO sector, Ms. Vasylenko worked as a corporate lawyer at B.C.Toms&Co, a law firm specialising in oil and gas and agriculture. She is a World Wide Studies Scholar and a 2011 graduate of the LLM program at University College London. Ms. Vasylenko is Co-Chair of the Volunteer Council of the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine and sits on a number of the government committees dealing with veteran issues. She is married and has two children.

Victor VEKLITCH is General Manager at JTI Ukraine since 2013. He has been with JTI Ukraine for more than 19 years, joining the company in 1998 as Merchandising Services Manager, and worked on different positions in Marketing and Sales. In 2009, Mr. Veklitch was appointed as Vice President, Consumer and Trade Marketing in Ukraine, and in early 2013 he became responsible for the development of those functions in Romania, Moldova and Bulgaria.

Iryna VERESHCHUK is President of the International Centre for Black Sea-Baltic Studies and Consensus Practices. She holds a PhD in Public Administration and is an officer of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. Dr. Vereshchuk was the youngest mayor in Ukraine serving the city of Rava-Ruska in 2010-2015. She studied at the Lviv Regional Institute of Public Administration of the National Academy for Public Administration under the President of Ukraine. Dr. Vereshchuk is a winner of the Lane Kirkland Scholarship Program of Polish-American Freedom Foundation and Open World. In 2016 she received a diploma from the Academy of Public Administration in Warsaw (KSAP).

Alexander "Sandy" VERSHBOW is a distinguished fellow at the Atlantic Council's Brent Scowcroft Center on International Security. Ambassador Vershbow was Deputy Secretary General of NATO from February 2012 to October 2016. Prior to his post at NATO, he served as the US Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs (2009-2012). From 1977 to 2008, Ambassador Vershbow was a career member of the United States Foreign Service. He served as the US ambassador to NATO (1998-2001); to the Russian Federation (2001-2005); and to the Republic of Korea (2005-2008). He held numerous senior positions in Washington, including Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for European Affairs at the National Security Council (1994-1997) and State Department Director for Soviet Union Affairs (1988-1991). In the course of his career, he was centrally involved in strengthening the US defense relations with allies in Europe and Asia, and in transforming NATO and other European security organizations to meet post-Cold War challenges. He also was involved in efforts to support democracy and human rights in the post-Soviet states. Ambassador Vershbow was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1952. He received a BA in Russian and East European Studies from Yale University.

Kateryna VEZIELIEVA-BORYSOVA is Deputy Head of Department at the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine. Previously, she served as a Member of Parliament's assistant and advisor (2005-2013). Afterwards, Ms. Vezielieva-Borysova held the posts of first secretary at the Embassy of Ukraine to the Russian Federation (2013-2014) and Deputy Director at the State Enterprise "Ukrkomunobslugovuvannya" ("Communal Services of Ukraine") under the Ministry of Regional Development, Building and Housing of Ukraine (2014-2015). She is a co-founder of NGOs "SD Platform" and "Institute for Democracy and Social Progress (IDSP)". Her areas of interest include youth politics and gender equality. In addition, Ms. Vezielieva-Borysova has been working as a coach and facilitator with different partner organizations. She has been educated in Economics and Management.

Alexander VINNIKOV is the Head of the NATO Representative Office in Ukraine since its creation in March 2016, and Director of the NATO Liaison Office (since September 2015). Prior to this, Mr. Vinnikov was the NATO Liaison Officer/Head of Office in Central Asia, resident in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, with a mandate covering the five countries of the region. He has previously worked at NATO Headquarters in both the Political Affairs and Security Policy Division and the Defence Policy and Planning Division. Mr. Vinnikov has also served with the OSCE in a variety of positions and duty stations, most recently as Senior Political Adviser to the High Commissioner on National Minorities in The Hague. Danylo VOLYNETS is a member of the Board of ITT Investment Group as well as a co-founder of Accordbank. He graduated from the Kyiv National Economic Institute (Kyiv National Economic University now) in 1980 and began his banking career in Stroybank USSR. After the launch of market reforms he founded one of the first cooperatives and international trade companies in the Ukrainian SSR. Mr. Volynets continued his entrepreneurial activity in international trade until 1995 when, upon the Presidential Decree on Investments, he together with partners founded and led ITT-Invest, one of the first investment companies in Ukraine. The ITT investment Group which has celebrated its 22nd anniversary this year became one of the leading groups in privatization, brokerage, private equity and asset management and repeatedly proved the efficiency of its investment strategy. Mr. Volynets continues to invest in commercial real estate and midcap production companies. He is an active sponsor and supporter of the Ukrainian Catholic University, National University of “Kyiv-Mohyla Academy” and other educational projects. Mr. Volynets also contributes to Ukrainian art funding art books publications and exhibitions.

Andreas VON BECKERATH is Deputy Director-General and Head of the Department for Eastern Europe, Russia and Central Asia at the Swedish Ministry for Foreign Affairs (since September 2017). Before taking up this position, he was Acting Head of the Department for Conflict and Humanitarian Affairs at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Sweden in 2016-2017 and the Ambassador of Sweden to Ukraine in 2013-2016. Hlib VYSHLINSKY is Executive Director of the Centre for Economic Strategy (CES) responsible for CES general management and its external relations. Mr. Vyshlinsky has over twenty years of experience in economic analysis and research. In December 2015, he was elected to the Council of the “Reanimation Package of Reforms” civic platform (RPR). In November 2016, Mr. Vyshlinsky was re-elected as a member of the Council of the RPR. From 2010 to April 2015, he served as Deputy Director of GfK Ukraine, the country’s leading marketing research agency, where Mr. Vyshlinsky had been working since 2003. Prior to that, in 1997-2003, he held a number of positions, including Senior Economist, Publication Director and Deputy Director, at the International Centre for Policy Studies. Mr. Vyshlinsky began his career as an economic journalist and editor, working in different mass media in 1993-1998.

Andriy VYSHNEVSKY is a public activist. He initiated the establishment of the Coordination Centre for Legal Aid Provision under the Ministry of Justice of Ukraine and headed it in 2012. As a Head of the Coordination Centre, he developed a national-wide legal aid system, funded by the Government, which started functioning on January 1, 2013. Currently the system has a network of 550 offices, providing legal aid to about 350 000 vulnerable people in criminal, civil and administrative cases annually. On April 19, 2017, Mr. Vyshnevsky was appointed to the position of Deputy Minister of Justice of Ukraine. He was responsible for the criminal justice reform, probation, reform of the bar and legal aid. He resigned on June 21, 2017 due to significant differences in value orientations with the Minister of Justice of Ukraine Pavlo Petrenko. He holds a Master's degree in Law (2005) and Biology (1999). During the period of 2004-2011, Mr. Vyshnevsky held the positions of Director of the Centre for Support of the Civil Service Institutional Development and Deputy Head of the Civil Service Administration of Ukraine, where he was responsible for drafting a new Law on Civil Service, establishment of the High School for Senior Civil Servants, implementation of the EU's Twinning, TAIEX and SIGMA tools in Ukraine. Peter WAGNER is Head of the Support Group for Ukraine at the European Commission and Director at the Directorate-General for Neighborhood and Enlargement Negotiations. Prior to this, Dr. Wagner was an advisor for the newly created Commission Task Force on Greece (TFGR) (2011-2015), Head of Unit in charge of the defence, aeronautic and maritime industries (2010-2011), and Head of Unit in the Directorate General for Enterprise and Industry, where his roles included general policy coordination, management of relations with Member States and the Council, and supervision and execution of the Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme (2005-2010).
